### Day One

Start the day off at **Bidford Skatepark** – take your skateboard or scooter and show off your skills. Alternatively, you could go to the ‘Big Meadow’ over the bridge and have a go on the new activity equipment and other play equipment as well as a basketball court if you fancy a game.



Try a local take out from **Aanando’s** for lunch and eat on one of the picnic benches along the river.

In the afternoon head over to the **Hidcote Maize Maze**, where each year a new maze is designed and built from growing maize, see if you can find your way round without getting lost. Be sure to check what dates the maze is open to avoid disappointment.



Catch a bus into the centre of **Stratford** where you will be spoilt for choice with the many different cafés and restaurants. Although some can be very expensive, it is easy to find a restaurant catering for low budgets and still serving high quality food.

### Day Two

Begin today with a game of **Mini Golf** near the Recreation Ground, which guarantees 18 holes of fun competition between friends. Take a picnic which you can enjoy near the river bank either on a bench or sat on the open grass.



After lunch, why not hire a rowing boat from **Avon Boating** and go up the river Avon? The boats require teamwork and are always a great experience for everyone. You also get lovely views of the church and the countryside along the way.
